



How can a member get to a \$0 copay?

With Cost Relief, employers and members receive savings on select specialty medicines.

With an Anthem plan, members get access to a **\$0 copay for select specialty medicines** and a better overall experience through the Cost Relief program. Employers also reduce their spend because members qualify for more copay assistance.

A member outreach program teaches members about Cost Relief and helps them to enroll. This program provides ongoing support to members.

Members must opt into the program to benefit from these savings. When a member enrolls, they'll save money on healthcare costs and you will, too.

Let's look at how a member can get to a \$0 copay:

Susan has a prescription for a specialty medication. The cost of the medication is \$1,500.¹



A Cost Relief representative reaches out to her about the program by mail, phone, and email.



Susan decides to enroll and is approved for the program.



She receives support to manage enrollment and renewals for copay programs.



Susan pays \$0 for her specialty medication.^{2, 3}

What does this mean for a member?

\$0 copay and support for enrollment and refills.

How can this affect you?

Up to \$8 per member per month net savings on your total specialty pharmacy benefit drug spend.⁴

What happens if a member decides not to enroll in the Cost Relief program?

If a member does not enroll in the program, they will be responsible for the coinsurance, which is 30% of the cost for preferred drugs and 45% for nonpreferred drugs. They can decide to enroll at any time by speaking with a specialty pharmacy representative.
